How does it apply to Producers of plastic?

- Single use plastic tonnages will be reported by the:
 - Converter i.e., the company in Ireland that makes single use plastic items or
 - Importer of empty or filled single use plastic or
 - Foreign Online Retailer

(exclude if sold/supplied to a Repak Member who is the importer)

- No deminimus applies
- Covers both packaging and non-packaging
- Covers plastic from Producers both inside and outside the State

How are Repak addressing the legislation?

- Repak will assist their members to comply with both the Packaging and Packaging
 Waste Directive and the Single Use Plastics Directive
- Repak will also facilitate producers inside and outside the State who are not current Repak Members
- This will require additional data reporting and compliance declarations from plastic producers
- Data will need to be collected from 2022 onwards
- Producers will be listed on an on-line Register of Compliance

What will it mean for me – Compliance declaration (draft)

I am aware that to be in compliance with the Single Use Plastics Legislation:

- It is prohibited from placing on the market single-use plastic products listed in Part B of the Annex and of products made from oxo-degradable plastic.
- Single-use plastic products listed in Part C of the Annex may only be placed on the market if their caps and lids remain attached to the containers during the products' intended use stage.
- From 2025, PET beverage bottles listed in Part F of the Annex must contain at least 25 % recycled plastic. (30% for all Plastic beverage bottles by 2030)
- Each single-use plastic product listed in Part D of the Annex placed on the market must bear a conspicuous, clearly legible and indelible marking on its packaging or on the product itself, conforming to the legislation requirements.

Note: 'The Directive' is (EU) Directive 2019/904 of 5 June 2019 on the reduction of the impact of certain plastic products on the environment, and it's associated Annex.

Please note the declaration must be signed by an employee of the producer company and an electronic signature will be deemed valid


